

Implementation


This is a great way to integrate poetry with a short story unit. Students read a short story and use the handout to transform the plot into a narrative poem. This is excellent to use at the end of a short story unit. Assign each student or pair of students a story the class has studied. Have them transform it into a narrative poem, share them with the class, viola! You have an instant review (and a mini-poetry study).

This handout is also included as part of my common-core aligned poetry unit bundle, complete with four weeks worth of common-core aligned daily lesson plans.


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
Writing a Narrative Poem:

 - Stanza 5 (resolution [the problem is solved]):
